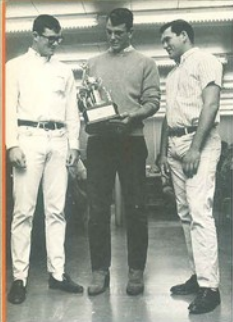

Team Works Hard to Gain

Rising above all predictions, the Norman High School football team once again became Boomer Conference Champions. Showing superb defense and excellent offense, the team came through with an undefeated conference season.

Very few will be able to forget the 21-20 surprise over Ada, the 34-7 victory over Lawton, and the 22-21 comeback over Ardmore, which decided the Boomer Conference Champs. Aided by their fellow-players, Joe Logan broke the school's passing records, and Carl Smith ran 93 yards for a touchdown. The team as a whole, set a school record with five consecutive shut-outs and six shutouts for the season.

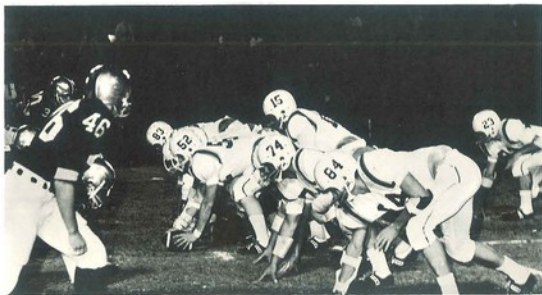


Quarterback Joe Logan (11), hands off to halfback Phil Jennings (40), who takes off around Duncan's end to gain Tiger yardage.

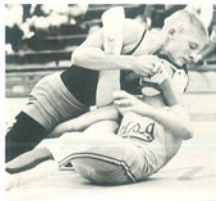
